

MASTER's CORNER

This month I'd like to draw your attention to something that's very obviously on everyone's mind—when will our Lodge return to normal? There are encouraging signs we may be nearing the end of the tunnel. The Grand Master's letter of February 1st is looking ahead to a time beyond the pandemic when we can meet and fellowship as before. As it says in our Ritual, man was *formed for social and active life, the noblest part of the work of God.* The Grand Lodge is looking ahead to the summer and fall and planning some big events to help us celebrate reuniting and getting us "fired up" for Masonry. As with everything in Masonry it's a matter of balance, but the message is clear—"Now is the time for us to start digging out, with safety and prudence absolutely at the forefront." Vaccines are being distributed, case numbers are falling, and while we're still limited to 10, the Governor is starting to ease other restrictions. I believe it's only a matter of a little more time and when we're able to open up more fully, we'll be ready.

A few other items. We're looking at a costly repair to the flat roof over the Main Lodge Room, and the Masonic Cemetery—the oldest in the Western Hemisphere—is greatly in need to repair. Last year, the FMMA put a proposal before the Lodge to install a series of columbaria at the Cemetery, for the purpose of establishing a trust to provide for its upkeep in perpetuity. There are many complex questions involved and I have appointed a committee to those questions and to coordinate between the Trustees, the FMMA, and the Lodge. The Columbarium Committee consists: Bros. Huey Allen, Pat McConnell, and Michael Spellman, and Wor. Bros. Chris Decker, Dan Goodwin, and Jamie Snyder. Please reach out to me or any of them with your questions. Over the coming months, the Committee will give monthly reports and hold one or more meetings with the Brethren. A Lodge vote is anticipated later this year. One thing is certain—we must begin to think strategically about the long-term sustainability of both the Cemetery and Building.

Lastly, planning for the 200th Anniversary of Lafayette's visit to the Lodge, in November 2024, has begun. One of the first milestones is the Lodge will receive a marker and be placed on the Lafayette Trail. Before that, the Lodge will be very much involved in commemorating the Centennial of the laying of the cornerstone of the George Washington Masonic National Memorial in 2023. You can see that exciting times lay ahead in the coming years. We can't know the future with certainty, of course. But I believe we will soon emerge from the hardship of the past year and that better days lie right around the corner.

Did you know: Andrew McNair, a Philadelphia Mason, rang the Liberty bell in Independence Hall of July 8, 1776 to call the people together to hear the reading of the Declaration of Independence. The bell developed a crack when it was rung for the death of Chief Justice Marshall, the Past Grand Master of Virginia.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

This month we'd like to showcase our Past Master from 200 years ago. Wor. Samuel Howison served as Master of Fredericksburg Lodge for a total of 8 years, second only to M.W. Benjamin Day (16 years). He served from 1820 to 1822, 1827 to 1831, and 1832 to 1834. His first term ran from 1820 - 1821. The most significant event in 1821 was the death of M.W. Day. In those days, the Lodge held its installations in June, on St. John the Baptist Day (June 24th). It was common for Masters to serve two consecutive terms until Wor. Alvin Embrey, 1900 – 1902. The last to serve for two, nonconsecutive years was Wor. William MacKenzie in 1938 and 1945.

Wor. Howison (1779 – 1845) was a banker and notary public in Fredericksburg. With his wife Helen Rose Moore he had 12 children. Theirs was a distinguished family—his son John would build Braehead, while his daughter Jane Howison Beale would become a famous Civil War diarist. On his death, the Alexandria Gazette reported that he was "long a respectable and highly esteemed resident of Fredericksburg, Va." He is buried at Fredericksburg City Cemetery.
