

MASTER's CORNER

Brethren, March is here, and spring is around the corner!

Lodge #4 had the pleasure and honor of hosting the Grand Lodge of California on February 18th as they opened their Grand Lodge in our historic Lodge. Grand Master Randal Brill sat in the East and led their wonderful ritual. It was an excellent experience to witness how they perform their ritual.

On February 22nd, Wor. Christopher Tripp (PM), Wor. Shelby Chandler (PM), and I were present at the Wreath Laying at Brother George Washington's tomb to celebrate his birth.

It is my sad duty to inform everyone that Worshipful Frank Jones has laid down his working tools. Worshipful Brother Frank was a member of Lodge #4, was our Blood Drive Coordinator, and a member of the E.H. Cann Daylight Lodge #1752 where he was the sitting Worshipful Master. Worshipful Frank was active in the Acca Shrine and is survived by his wife Betty. A Masonic Funeral will be conducted for Worshipful Frank on March 11th, at 1 pm at Fredericksburg Baptist Church.

On March 4th (after the Pancake Breakfast) a Lodge from New York State will be Passing one of their members to the Degree of Fellow Craft in our Lodge. This is a significant event in that George Washington Lodge #285 was here in our Lodge on the same day in 1923 to celebrate Brother George Washington's Passing to Fellow Craft. Market Stats

In February in the greater Fredericksburg area, 130 homes closed. 38% sold in 10 days or less. This is more evidence that there is still high demand for well maintained homes priced reasonably. Many of our clients buying homes are still facing bidding wars.

As of this writing on February 28th, 2023, **there are only 109 homes on the market in the Fredericksburg area** - fewer than sold last month and we're entering the peak spring season. That means right now there is less than one month's of inventory available.
