

- BE POSITIVE. Never see a situation as impossible. Accept the challenge, overcome every obstacle, and produce positive results that benefit EVERYONE.
- Embody due order and decorum. Follow proper protocol and etiquette. Avoid private conversations during meetings and degrees.
- Never harbor piques or quarrels against another brother. Go to him. Solve the issue. Make amends. Heal all wounds. Strengthen the bond.

Secretary's Corner

Brethren, this is where I'd normally be be expected to gently pester you to pay your dues, etc., etc. However, it is my great pleasure to report that this year we have *no* Brethen at risk of being suspended for nonpayment! This is largely due to the diligent efforts of our Master in contacting those who were in arrears as well as the efforts of our previous Master and Secretary last year.

Last month I remarked on the short list of anniversaries; this month, we have a very long one. I think it is due to many One-Day Classes being scheduled in August, as we have a bumper crop of 16-year-old Masons, as well as several 9-year-old and 6-year-old Masons. If we checked, I would bet we had One-Day Conferrals on August 16, 2008 and August 29, 2015. My part in pulling together the Trestle Board is easy, as Worshipful does most of the work. The most time consuming part is assembling the anniversary list. Grand View almost generates this automatically, but I do agonize over how to present their names—do I use their short names we all know from Lodge or how they're listed in Grand View? I have decided the later option is safer. Then they get sorted by length of service, after which I go back to make sure we use their proper Masonic titles. While it is said the greatest title one can receive is 'Brother' and the lambskin or white leather apron is more honorable than anything else that can be conferred upon a man, we Masons revere service, hard work, diligence, and decorum. As it says in the Charge to the Junior Warden at his installation, the time will come when all distinctions but those of merit and goodness shall cease. So we try to render every Brother his due and if there is any lapse, ask your indulgence. Trying to come up with something other than the usual boring secretarial stuff is the next hardest thing...so in these 'dog days' of August (see next article), let's ponder for a minute the duties of the Secretary. He is charged carefully to observe the proceedings of the Lodge, and to *keep a fair record of all things proper to be written*...we're not just talking about the Minutes of the Lodge, but we have a weighty duty to preserve the Lodge's history for future generations. A '*fair record*'...to be objective and impartial in assisting in the administration of the Lodge and dealing with our Brethren; '*proper to be written*'...to be discreet and circumspect in our communications...not just talking about the Secretary anymore. The Craft (and a dog) in Community

You never know where life will lead you. After I retired two years ago, we decided to get a dog to keep our empty nest not quite so empty. Sophie is a Berndedoodle (a combination of the Bernese Mountain Dog and the Poodle) and is a joy to have. To make sure she would be socialized, I would take her to the dog park almost every day, which quickly became part of my daily routine. While there, she would go to each person to check on them and give some puppy love. It was suggested she would make a wonderful therapy dog and at that we were off. I researched the required training and selected a trainer to send her to, where she stayed for two weeks (not required but I would recommend it). When Sophie returned, she was well behaved and we continued working with her on our own, in addition to weekly group sessions. I am proud of where she is.



The lodge has been a large part of Sophie's journey to becoming a therapy dog. During her training, I would bring her to any event or meeting I could. She has been a regular member of Daylight Lodge, Wednesday meetings, pancake breakfasts, Job's Daughters and Tuesday homeless meals. I also had two candidates during this time and she and listened to all the catechism (and is probably better than I am at it now). All this helped to shape us as a team, meeting and interacting with people in different situations, ages and distractions. The homeless meal was difficult at first, with all the food about.

Where are we now: Sophie has her AKC Canine Good Citizens Certificate, certified therapy dog with K-9 Caring Angels and Alliance of Therapy Dogs. We have been working as a therapy team since February and have visited special needs classes, elementary, middle and high schools, a juvenile detention center and a memory center. The original group I joined is centered in northern Virginia and I recently found Blue Gray Therapy Dogs, which is local and we have joined their organization. Through them, I am now working on getting access to Mary Washington Health Care, to include both Fredericksburg and Stafford hospitals. Blue Gray Therapy Dogs have a major reading program at libraries and schools where the kids read to the dogs. I have also volunteered to pick up a middle school, and we will be their primary therapy team with weekly visits for reading or therapy but also, if there is an incident or situation at the school, and they would like support, we will be there.

If you have the time, this is an amazing way to invest your time. To see the kids/people light up when you walk in the door with your friend is just amazing.
