

#### Secretary's Corner

Brethren, a couple things to bring to your attention this month. First, dues invoices have been sent out for the first time via Grand View, which now has the capability to collect and track dues payments. This will help to ensure that we have an accurate membership database and that we're billing dues-paying members, and only dues-paying members, for dues. If you're not currently registered for Grand View, I'd strongly urge you to sign up. In addition to paying your dues, you can see all the information Grand Lodge has on you and access many other resources, such as finding Masonic Lodge meetings and events. Please take a moment to ensure we have your most up-to-date address, phone

number, and email (used for sending dues invoices). If you're not signed up and need assistance, please reach out and I will be glad to assist you.

Dues have increased to \$225 this year. Letting part of the automatic Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) kick in was not an easy decision by the Lodge leadership, but was necessary to keep up with increased costs of operating and maintaining the Lodge. I'd like to remind you that if paying your dues is a financial hardship, the Master has the discretion to remit your dues. Don't let yourself get into a situation where you are in danger of being suspended.

Note that at the moment, you're only being invoiced for your current dues. As we move further in using Grand View, any past dues balances will be added.

Payment of dues through Grand View is for your convenience, but you can also still pay by PayPal on the website, by check, or by cash. I ask that you not hand me cash other than when we're at a stated or called communication, so it can be appropriately logged. Please do not mail cash. If you mail a check, please use P.O. Box 702, Fredericksburg, VA 22404-0702 rather than our street address. Please note that dues cards have not been received due to printing issues and will be somewhat delayed this year. As soon as we have received them and your dues are paid, your card will be mailed to you.

Lastly, thank you for entrusting me with serving as your Secretary. This year has been a steep learning curve and I haven't handled everything as quickly as I wanted. Next year, should you continue to have me in that role, I plan to serve and handle your business in a more efficient manner. Please do not hesitate to reach out, as that's why we're here—to serve you and facilitate your needs throughout your Masonic journey.
