

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Market Stats

Homes are on the market for an average of **34 days** before going under contract. This is **up 8 days** since last month, but still indicative of a **normalizing** market for this area.

Current reports are showing 4.5 months of housing supply inventory, up from only 54 days of inventory supply last month. However, these statistics are misleading because they reflect all new "for sale" listings **which** include "to be built" home listings. A Builder may have several different "to be built" listings advertised on one single lot which means there aren't 10 homes of inventory for sale, there is only 1, and it isn't even built yet. There are plenty of over priced listings out there, but we're also back to facing bidding wars on the best homes on the market. Demand came pouring back into the market when mortgage interest rates settled back down to mid 5% range. We're even seeing cash investors competing at market prices against primary residence home buyers because they understand the underlying housing shortage and prefer to have money invested in a hard asset instead of sitting in a bank account.

Spring Buying Season is Starting Early

It has been a relatively warm winter and that supports real estate market activity. Inventory is remaining low and while we expect more homes to come on the market in the spring, demand is already strong. We have clients buying homes because of up to \$500 per month rent increases so we expect to see more of that in the spring when leases begin to expire and landlords make large rent increases to catch up with the market; high rents are supporting the housing market.

Rate Perspective

Mortgage interest rates peaked at 7.25% in the fall and have since settled back down to the mid 5% range. Rates haven't been above 6% since about 2003 and prior to that they ranged from 6.5% to 18% so anything in the 5's is still below the last 40 years of mortgage rates. The market is realizing rates won't go back to the historical COVID lows so consumers are normalizing to the new rates as the need for housing overcomes the disappointment of not buying something sooner.
