Finally, Brethren, I will leave you with my favorite working tool—the plumb! My Dad is a retired land surveyor, and I had the opportunity to work for him growing up. The plumb or plumb bob is one of the most important tools in surveying. The plumb holds a special nostalgic place in my heart. A quick Google search reveals that the instrument has been used since at least the time of ancient Egypt to ensure that constructions are

"plumb" or vertical (i.e., to try perpendiculars). It is also used in surveying, to establish the nadir (opposite of zenith) with respect to gravity of a point in space. It is used with a variety of instruments (including levels, theodolites, and steel tapes) to set the instrument exactly over a fixed survey marker or to transcribe positions onto the ground for placing a marker. Stone masons of the guilds in Europe relied on plumbs and plumb levels in their work, and the importance of these and other tools has carried over symbolically into Freemasonry. In Masonry, we know that the plumb admonishes us to walk uprightly in our several stations of life before God and man.

Furthermore, of the plumb, the 1946 version of Mackey's Revised Encyclopedia Freemasonry (Vol. 2) says, "it is a symbol of rectitude of conduct and inculcates that integrity of life and undeviating course of moral uprightness which can alone distinguish the good and just man. As the operative workman erects his temporal building with strict observance of that plumb-line, which will not permit him to deviate a hair's breadth to the right or to the left, so the Speculative Freemason, guided by the unerring principles of right and truth inculcated in the symbolic teachings of the same implement, is steadfast in pursuit of truth, neither bending beneath the frowns of adversity nor yielding to the seductions of prosperity."

I admit it. I moved my plumb just a hair to the right or left a few times during my time working for my Dad—it's pretty easy to get distracted! Fortunately, only causing a little extra work for the day rather than ruining an entire survey. Likewise, I have certainly moved my plumb a hair to the right or left several times in life. Although sometimes causing pain or disappointment, fortunately life doesn't demand such exactness. But as we strive to erect temples of living stones, the plumb does demand that we try to be exact, because I think we are living plumbs and it is through our example that others will strive to stand uprightly too.
