Master's Moment

REMEMBER, our November Stated Communication is on MONDAY, NOVEMBER 4, 2024. November 4th is traditionally the Grand Master's last official visit of his year. Accordingly, we will be welcoming Most Worshipful Jack Kayle Lewis, the 178th Grand Master of Masons in Virginia.

Most Worshipful Lewis was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in Kent Lodge No. 305 on April 28, 1980. He served as Worshipful Master in 1984, 1988, and 2013, and as District Deputy Grand Master for the 38th Masonic District in 2014. He then served the 38th District from 2015-2018 as the District Educational Officer and as Lodge Secretary from 2015–2022. At the Grand Annual Communication in November 2017, Brother Lewis was elected Grand Junior Deacon. His Masonic services since that day have been extensive. During his tenure as Grand Master, his theme and emphasis has been "Freemasonry — Building Better Leaders." Please come out to help us give Most Worshipful Lewis a hearty Fredericksburg welcome!

Over the weekend of November 23-24, we commemorate Brother Lafayette's visit to our Lodge and our city. Information about the whole weekend of festivities is available at https://fxbg.com/lafayette/.

On Sunday, November 24, the public is invited to join us as we reenact Worshipful William Gray's reception of Lafayette at 10:30 am in the Lodge Room. Right Worshipful Shelby Chandler will give a brief history of Masonry and of our Lodge during the 1820s. Then Worshipful Pat McConnell will be joined by Lafayette interpreter Mark Schneider to present Worshipful Gray's reception speech to the General and Lafayette's response. Next, General Lafayette will hold a question-and-answer session with those in attendance. Finally, Mr. Chuck Schwam, Executive Director of the American Friends of Lafayette, will have remarks for the audience.

Also on November 24, the public is invited to attend a book talk by Brother Chris Ruli about his new book, *Brother Lafayette*. Our country's Freemasons played a pivotal role and embraced Lafayette as a soldier, statesman, and fellow Mason. *Brother Lafayette* examines the Marquis' often misunderstood connection to the ancient Fraternity and provides the most detailed account, through Masonic records, newspapers, letters, and diaries, of how American Freemasons extended a heartfelt welcome to a fellow brother of the Mystic Tie.

November is the perfect opportunity to present our Lodge and the Craft to our community. I hope Fredericksburg Lodge No. 4 can turn out in numbers to support these events.

My Brothers, it is that time of year to set the annual dues amount for 2025. Section 2.86 of the Methodical Digest indicates that the by-laws of Subordinate Lodges may add an annual Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) to a base dues amount. Accordingly, Article II of our by-laws indicates that members are to be charged annual dues composed of a base dues amount (\$150 set in 2020), the Grand Lodge Assessment (\$55), plus a COLA (based on the Consumer Price Index inflation calculator). Current dues are \$215 and have been held at this amount for the past two years. However, our dues should be \$238 under the by-laws and if we want to fully account for the rise in inflation over the last couple of years.

The good news is that annual dues for 2025 will only be going up by \$10—from \$215 to \$225! The Worshipful Master can remit members' dues in part to keep the amount at \$215 or some amount up to \$238. An increase is needed, but the more modest increase of \$10 seems fair at this time. Even \$10 more a year will still significantly help maintain our historic building and help fund our activities to support the Brethren. Please note the rising costs of food, utilities, and everything else associated with running a Lodge. The dues notices that will go out in mid-November will reflect the new dues amount of \$225.

Finally, Brethren, November is the time of Thanksgiving. I am extremely thankful for all of you. I hope you and yours have a wonderful, happy, and blessed Thanksgiving.

We will soon be issuing dues notices for 2025. Please take a minute to check your contact information and make sure we have your correct email and mailing address.

As in past months, I'd ask you to consider one of your often overlooked officers—the Marshal. Not only does he have the solemn duty and great honor of presenting the Flag of our Country at our Sacred Altar, it is his duty to conduct all public processions of the Lodge. This is an important duty, whether at the all-important Masonic funeral service, in marching to our annual Memorial Day observance at the Masonic Cemetery, or other such events. I was struck by the Grand Marshal's leading the dignified procession of the Grand Lodge officers at the cornerstone laying ceremony at Mount Vernon last month. But as with all Masonic symbols, let us look deeper—in asserting a definite order during all such processions, it reminds us that each of us has a role and a place in the Lodge, and that we're all moving in the same direction in our Masonic journey. Yet though some may be in front and others behind, we're all equal in worth—they're not going to start till we all get where we're going. The Installation Ceremony also states that the Marshal is responsible for 'the respectable appearance of the Craft,' which depends in great measure on his 'energy, promptness, and decision.' Are we mindful of our 'respectable appearance' as men and Masons? Do we have energy and enthusiasm? Do we show up on time? Can we, when we're called on to lead our Brethren, make a decision? I'll leave you with a quote attributed to Bro. Teddy Roosevelt, whom you may guess is one of my Masonic heroes: 'In any moment of decision, the best thing you can do is the right thing, the next best thing is the wrong thing, and the worth thing you can do is nothing.'
